

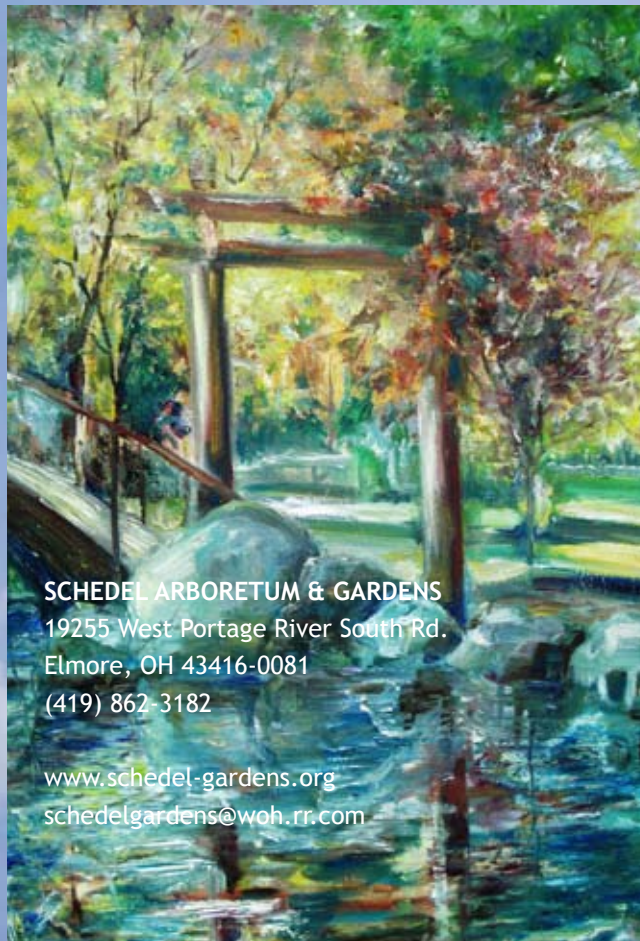

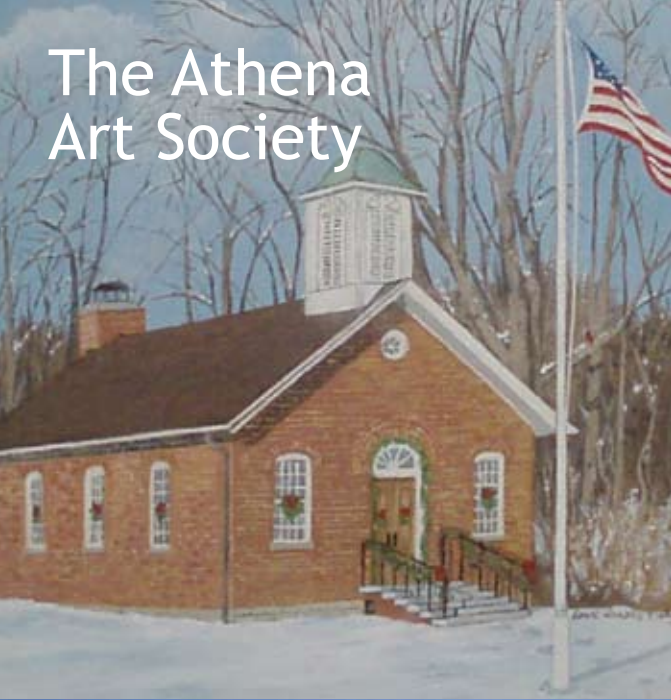

It was founded in 1903, at the original Toledo Museum of Art, by a group of 18 Toledo women artists, led by Nina Spalding Stevens, wife of George W. Stevens.
